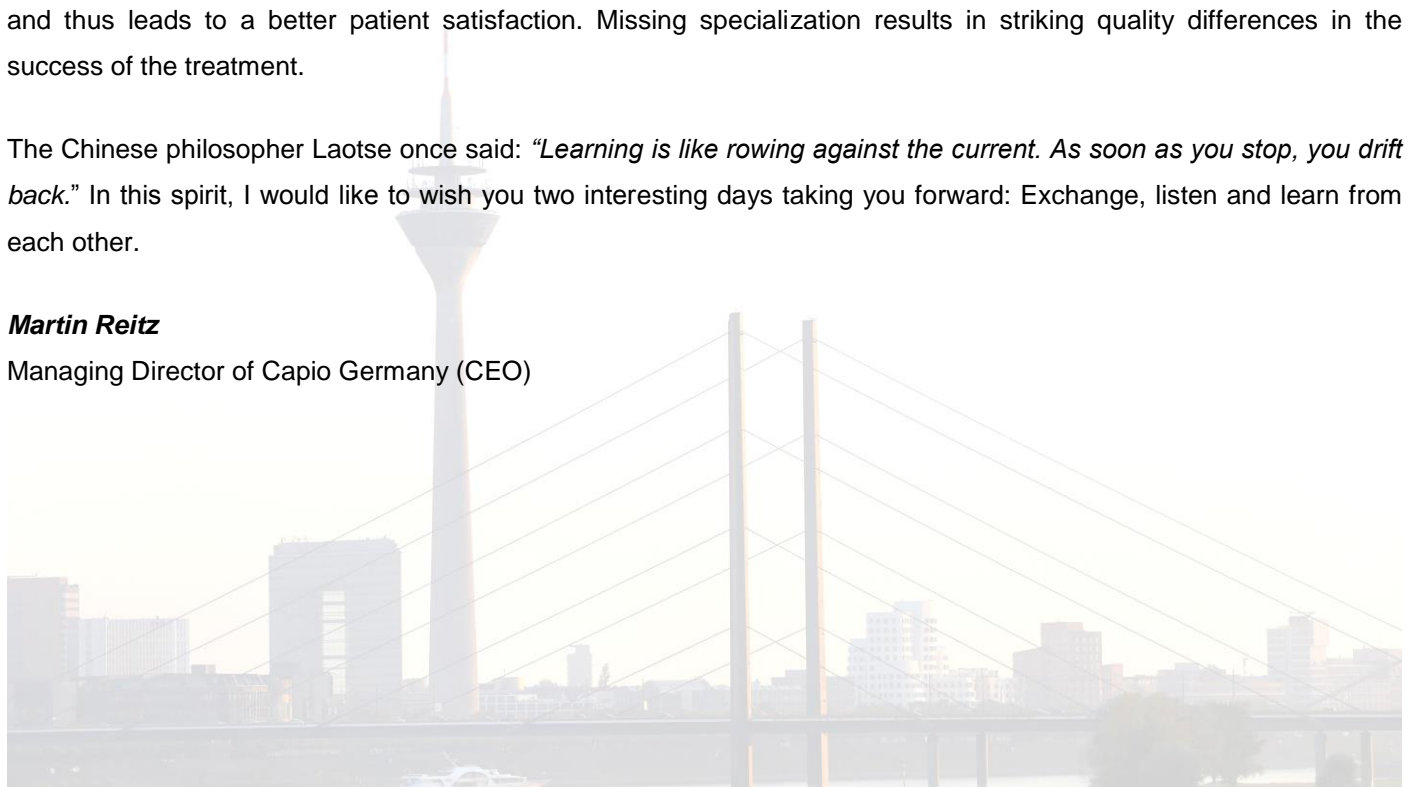

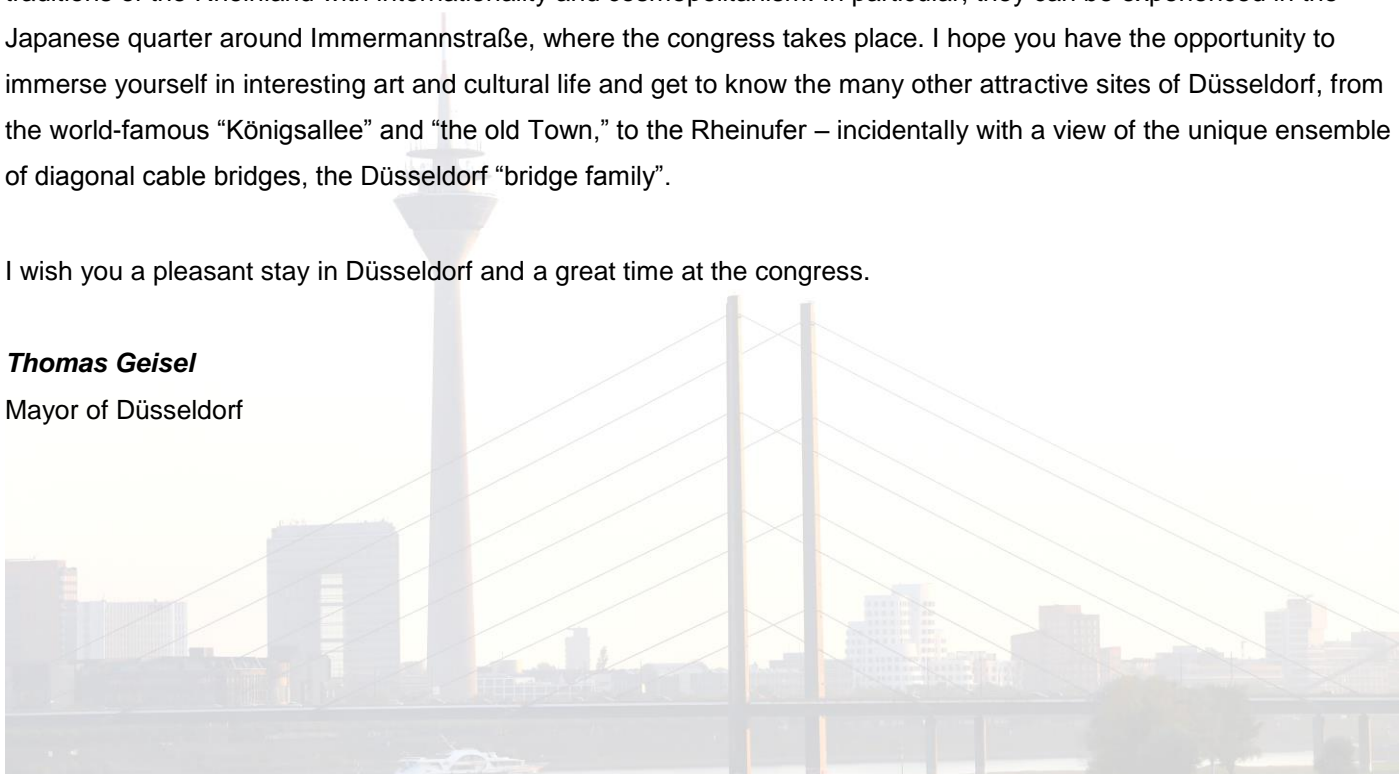

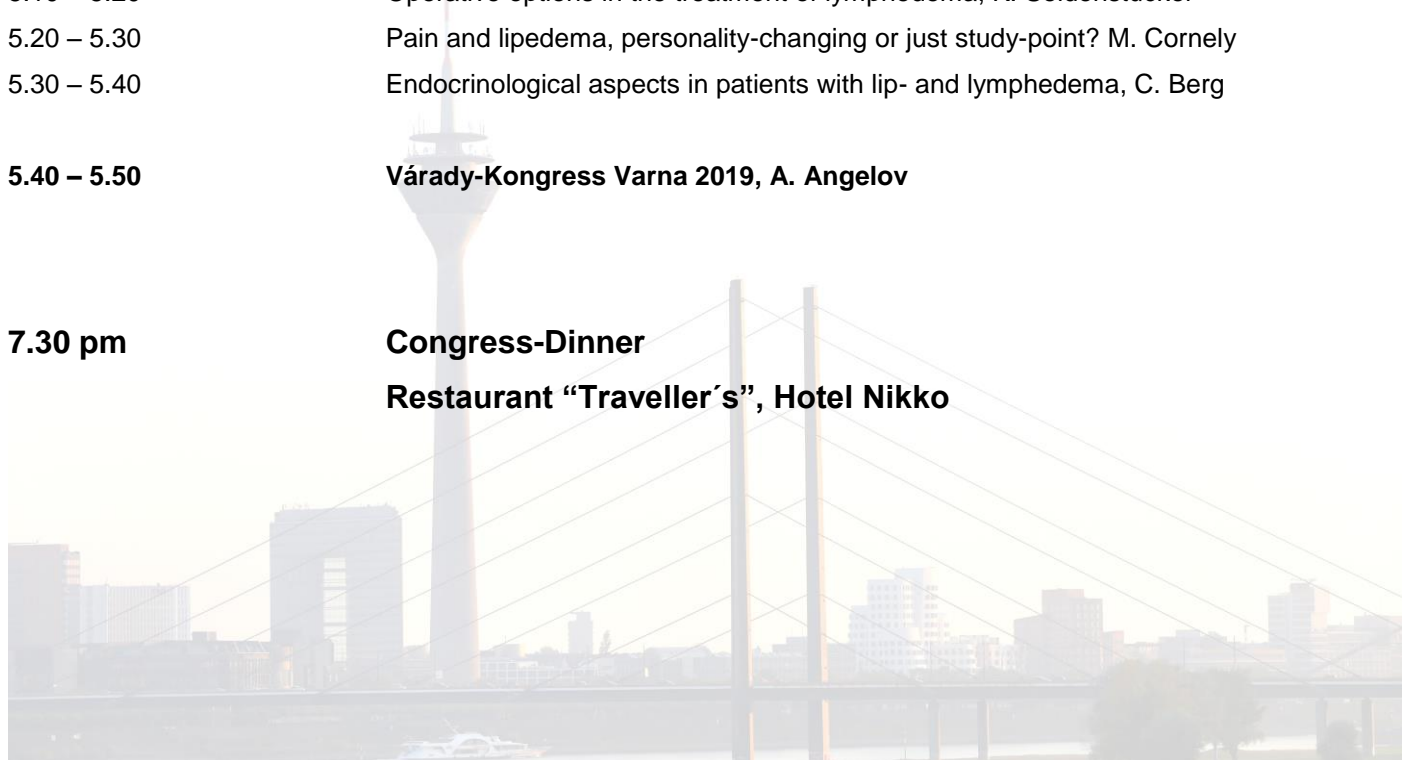

Take B1 at Neuss / Hafen junction in direction of Düsseldorf. At fourth intersection, turn off onto Merowinger Straße direction to Düsseldorf Zentrum. Continue straight until the end of Friedrichstraße, then turn right into Graf-Adolf-Straße. After 700 m, at the large post office on the right, turn left into Immermannstraße. Hotel Nikko is on the left.

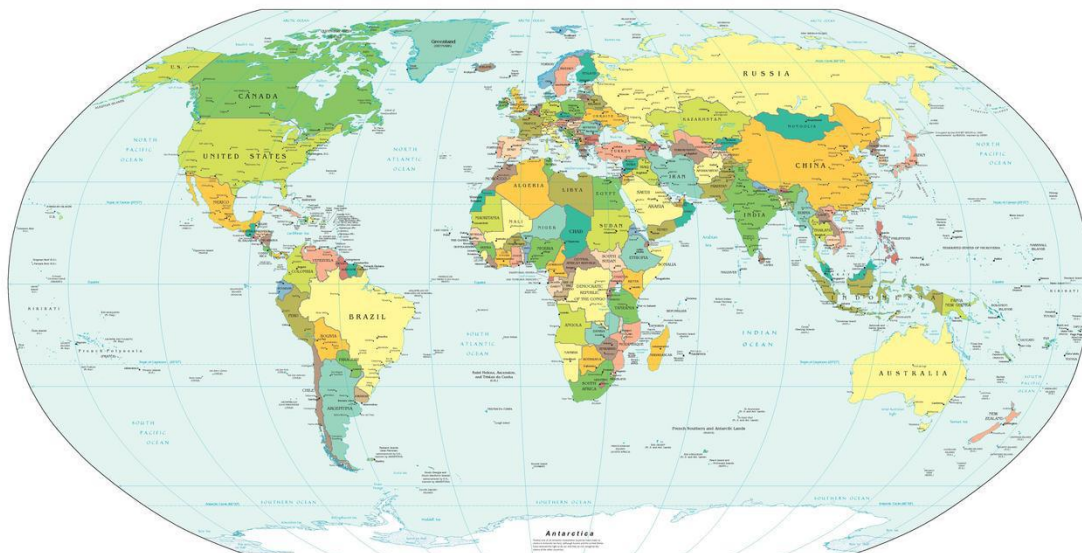
